The following section of the Sid Dennis and Sons Ltd Environmental Policy deals with specific arrangements for the management of environmental issues at Sid Dennis and Sons Ltd.

CORE ENVIRONMENTAL PRINCIPALS TO BE IMPLEMENTED ACROSS THE WHOLE BUSINESS:

Reduce Greenhouse gas emissions including Carbon Dioxide

The business will adapt to combat climate change. It will seek to minimise energy use in every area of its work including transport, heating and lighting. It will continue to improve energy efficiency in all its buildings and to use and promote renewable energy.

Minimise Water consumption

The business will endeavour to reduce water consumption in all of its buildings and on land. It will seek to implement measures to reduce pollution entering waste-water and recycle water wherever possible.

Procure products and services, which do least damage to the environment

Where possible all procurements will be made on the basis of sustainable design and construction, taking whole life costs into account.

Waste Management

As its core business value Sid Dennis & Sons Ltd promotes sound waste management practices. It ensures that all waste processed at the site is sorted into clean waste streams for onward recycling. This is not only a core business value but also an essential financial driver. Waste production is minimised and material consumption reduced to the lowest practical level. Materials are re-used and recycled wherever possible. Any waste that cannot be re-used or recycled is disposed of in the safest and most responsible manner.

Minimising Pollution

The business will minimise and monitor pollution. Any pollution caused by the business will be identified and remedied put in place as soon as possible.

The transport fleet will be managed to promote sustainable transportation of waste materials so as to minimise the environmental impact and reduce the need for unnecessary journeys.

Natural Landscape and built environment

The business will protect the land upon which it is situated, encourage wildlife and increase biodiversity. It will also protect and enhance the historical buildings based on its traditional farm site.

Sustainable development

In its own activities, plans and policies, Sid Dennis & Sons Ltd will promote sustainable business development and work closely with the community to encourage sustainable practices and lifestyles.

PRACTICAL APPLICATION OF CORE ENVIRONMENTAL PRINCIPLES:
